King Monivong

Multi-valued sets of stamps were issued in 1936 to honor members of royalty from previously conquered kingdoms. King Sisowath Monivong was the titular ruler of Cambodia.


















King Monivong

Sisowath Monivong (1875-1941) became King of Cambodia upon the death of his father in 1927. Despite having fathered 24 children with eight wives, none of his offspring succeeded him. Believing that he would be pliable to their will, French officials installed Norodom Sihanouk as king.






PERIOD POSTCARD SHOWING KING MONIVONG ON HIS WAY TO THE ANNUAL WATER FESTIVAL.

Engravers used proofs to ensure that the master die contains all the intended details without any flaws. Proofs were printed using colors that enhanced the details, not necessarily the colors of the issued stamps.





King Monivong 2\$ Proof

A proof of the high value 2-piaster stamp was printed in blue while this denomination was ultimately printed with black ink.

The date of printing was applied with black ink in the bottom right corner of the selvedge in DD.MM.YY format.

Two 2-cent King Monivong commemorative stamps paid for mailing a picture postcard to France in 1937. The postcard rate to France and colonies had been set at 4 cents since 1928.

A 4-cent Monivong stamp contributed to the 9-cents worth of franking on a tourist's postcard sent to the United States in 1938. By just a week, the mailing beat the increase in the rate for foreign postcards from 9 cents to 10 cents effective 1 April 1938.


